### Former Inmate Testimony

NOTE: It is a joy to share with you some photo highlights of our Annual October Dinner/Fundraiser Event, including highlights of this POWERFUL, FORMER inmate testimony from Brad Beck! (Brad's parents and 6 family / friends also attended to support Brad and RLPM!)

I was raised in Missouri by Christian parents who owned a carnival. I grew up traveling across the country, and by age 10, I started smoking tobacco; at age 12, pot; and by age 15, meth. I started hearing voices, and that's when I began cutting myself to try to silence them. I was sent to a psych hospital, where they taught me to blame shift. I was in and out of rehabs, dropped out of high school, and was arrested in 3 states for stealing cars and running from the cops.



Brad Beck shared his powerful testimony of how God transformed his most difficult life while he was in prison!

Soon after my 20th birthday, I was in a fatal car accident and woke up in the hospital. They told me a 39-year-old father of 3 had been killed! I fell into deep depression and became very suicidal, which led to more drugs. After

being convicted of first-degree manslaughter, I had a 10-year prison sentence. Following my release, I had gotten sober but began drinking alcohol at a bowling alley, which led me back to meth. This time I started cooking it, and my house was later raided for a meth lab. (And I was incarcerated again.)

While at the Tulsa County Jail, I got beat up badly over drugs. Then I got wonderfully saved! I was later sent to North Fork Correctional Center in Sayer, OK, where I received the infilling of the Holy Spirit and total deliverance from drugs and depression!

In 2019, I was sent to JBCC in McAlester, OK, where I started attending Redeeming Love Prison Ministry chapel services regularly. Plus, I took a lot of classes, did some correspondence Bible studies to better myself, and read the book God's Grace Liberates by Sharla Yoder. I also loved the way RLPM conducted their services, always not only giving invitations for salvation but one-on-one prayer for the infilling of the Holy Spirit, healing and deliverance from addictions, and personal needs. One of their Ambassadors, Ina Dilldine, prayed

several times with me about a new wife and other things. And I was able to take training in prison to become a certified auto transmission mechanic.

Since my release, God has

EXCEEDINGLY blessed me in so many
ways! I have a wonderful job at Aspen
Transmission in Broken Arrow, OK. I met
my new Christian wife, and we were
married in January of this year! We just

moved into a nice home and our family attends church together. I volunteer as a counselor at John 3:16 Mission and the Tulsa Hope Center.

Thank you so much for your support of Redeeming Love Prison Ministry. I have experienced firsthand how much God has used them to change my life and so many other prisoners' lives as well!
